## **Near West Theatre Celebrates Spring with Production of *The Secret Garden***

Cleveland, OH (April 22, 2010) - Near West Theatre (NWT) announces its upcoming performances of the Broadway musical based on Frances Hodgson Burnett's children's classic, *The Secret Garden*. Opening on May 7 and running through May 23, performances take place on the third floor of St. Patrick's Club Building at the corner of West 38<sup>th</sup> Street and Bridge Avenue in Ohio City.

*The Secret Garden* tells the story of Mary Lennox, an 11-year old girl who, after being orphaned in India, returns to Yorkshire to live with an embittered, reclusive uncle and his invalid son. The estate includes a magic locked garden that draws Mary's interest and leads her to discover that the mansion holds many secrets. Flashbacks, dream sequences, a strolling chorus of ghosts and some of the most beautiful music ever written for Broadway dramatize this inspiring story about the restorative powers of love, regeneration and rebirth.

Performances are Fri.-Sat. May 7 & 8, Thurs-Sun., May 13-16, and Fri.-Sun., May 21-23. Curtain times on Thursday, Fridays, and Saturdays are at 7:30 pm and Sundays at 3:00 pm. All offerings are at St. Patrick's Club Building, located at W.38<sup>th</sup> and Bridge Avenue\* in Ohio City and include free parking. Adult tickets are \$8 and children, 12 & under, are \$6. The Star Seat ticket, which helps NWT fill the gap between the affordable rate it offers its patrons and the actual cost of the production, is \$20 and includes a concession coupon.
